



Public Works



Baddeck ReUse Centre

Since opening in April 2018, the ReUse Centre has been a huge success! Open every summer from April to October, non-profit groups operate for three consecutive Saturdays from 9—12 pm. All materials in the building are donated by residents. The goal to divert useful items from the landfill, has given local non-profits an opportunity to raise funds and allow people to buy gently-used items at a discounted price. Groups interested in getting involved for the 2024 season can apply beginning late January/early February. Applications submitted by the set deadline are placed in a draw, chosen at random, and the first group is assigned to the first three Saturdays, the second group the next three Saturdays and so on.

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Property Tax Information



What is the 2023 Tax Rate in Victoria County?

- Resident property owners pay \$1.22 per \$100 of the property assessment
- Commercial property owners pay \$2.12 per \$100 of the property assessment
- Resource property owners pay \$1.22 per \$100 of their property assessment



How are my property taxes calculated?

- The amount of property taxes you pay is based on the Tax Rate X your property's assessed value and then divided by 100.
- The current taxation fiscal year goes from April 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024
- Your property taxes are due on August 1, 2024



- **General Government:** (council, administrative departments, annual grants to organizations)
- **Fire and Protective Services** (volunteer fire department funding, fire services/EMO, planning, RCMP mandatory contribution)
- Transportation Services (Maintenance of J class roads and municipality owned roads, streetlights, Victoria County Transit)
- **Solid Waste, Collection and Disposal:** (two transfer stations, two recycling depots, weekly curbside pickup, trucking waste to landfill)
- Recreation and Tourism Services, Economic Development (recreation grants to community organizations, school/rink recreation funding, trail development, placemaking, tourism initiatives)

Senior Safety

A Closer Look at the ACTing Collectively Project ACTing Collectively Dalhousie Team

ACTing Collectively is a project focused on connecting older adults (65+) to local services and programs. In partnership with the Municipality of Victoria County, the project is testing the Age Care Technologies (ACT™) assessment tool. This tool is helping the project team identify and share the concerns of older adults with local planners and decision-makers.

The tool includes an assessment/interview that asks older adult participants to reflect on their life and any concerns they may have. Through a one-hour conversation with a trained Assessor, the participant can learn about local resources available to help them age at home in their community. Information from the interview is summarized and shared with the participant in a personalized action plan.

The project has also provided an opportunity for the Municipality to connect with community-living older adults.

Baddeck Nordic Club

Newest club on the scene with an enthusiastic group of dedicated local skiiers and in 2022, a generous landowner offered their land to develop a network of groomed and signed trails nestled at the foot of the Cape Breton Highlands.

North Highlands Nordic

Located in Cape North, North Highlands Nordic offers equipment rentals, warming facilities, learn to ski clinics for kids. Plenty of groomed trails for snowshoes and skis. Crowdis Mountain Snowmobile Club

Part of the 20 snowmobile clubs in Nova Scotia, this active club has over 120 members that includes cross-country skiiers, snowshoe enthusiasts and snowmobilers. The club maintains approxomately 225 kms of groomed trails.

Ski Tuonela - Telemark ski area

Ski-in destination offering the only serviced Telemark ski area in the Maritimes. 4 kilometre backcountry/outback skiing with gladed hill. 18 kms cross-country trails, equipment rentals, chalet accommodations and sauna.

Ski Cape Smokey

Ski hill offers skiing and snowboarding with stunning views of the Cape Breton Highlands. Located near Ingonish and offers 15 downhill runs or for those interested in snowshoeing, hike the back country trail to Hawley's Lake.

When does Council meet and can the public attend?


A: Whenever there are more than three Councillors meeting together, the meeting is open to the public to attend. Council meetings are livestreamed on our website unless there are technical issues. You are encouraged to attend and learn more about municipal issues. All meetings are found on the Victoria County website. Look under Municipal Calendar and find out when meetings are scheduled.



When does my property assessment come out?

A: Look for your 2024 Property Assessment Notice in January 2024. Assessments are determined by Property Valuation Services Corporation (PVSC) and they will be mailed to you by PVSC. Municipalities use this property assessment to determine your property tax for a given year.
