

2024 Municipal Election — October 19, 2024

- Blair Gallop is the Returning Officer for the 2024 Municipal Election in Victoria County.
- Victoria County will do electronic voting (internet and by phone) from Intelivote Systems Inc.
- Dates for advance polling period are set from Thursday,
 October 10, 2024 to October 19, 2024.
- Nomination Day is being held on Tuesday, September 10, 2024.
- The Returning Officer determines any additional notification mechanisms to improve accuracy of electors' lists.
- Returning Officer is responsible for public education on the upcoming election and offer information session(s) for potential candidates.

Plan Victoria County Update

What is Plan Victoria County?

Every municipality in Nova Scotia has to develop and adopt a comprehensive municipal plan to meet minimum planning standards. Plan Victoria County project is one part of the larger "Plan Eastern Nova" project and includes separate plans for the Municipalities of Antigonish, Richmond, and Inverness. The work is being undertaken by Halifax-based consulting firm UPLAND Planning + Design Studio.

Plan Victoria County is the planning strategy and land use by-law for unplanned areas of the Municipality of the County of Victoria. This encompasses the entire municipality, except for the Village of Baddeck, where no changes will be made to existing planning regulations at this time, as the Village has a municipal land use plan.

Plan Victoria County: Work to Date

Project planning began in the Fall of 2021 with public consultation meetings held from October 2021 to January 2022. This first phase involved a series of public meetings (in-person and online) to introduce the project, a public survey, an online mapping activity, a community workbook activity and a series of engagement interviews. An additional online meeting was held for any-



one who could not attend an in-person session and a recording of the presentation was uploaded to the project website.

Over winter 2022, the first Draft Municipal Planning Strategy (MPS) and Land Use By-law (LUB) were written. In spring and summer of 2022, another round of public consultation took place. This phase involved public meetings, a draft mapping activity and online feedback. In 2023, edits were made based on feedback and the second Draft MPS and LUB were released for public review in February 2024. The engagement period closed on March 31, 2024.

Next Steps

The draft planning documents will now go through another round of edits based on direction received from Victoria County Council at a meeting in April 2024. The final draft MPS and LUB will go for Council First Reading, followed by a Public Hearing and Second Reading. If passed by Council, the documents will go for final review by the provincial government before December 31, 2024.

Waste Educator's wormy experiment discovers compost gold!

Over the past half year, as a pilot initiative, Victoria County's Maddy MacPherson tried a growing trend among savvy composters called vermicomposting or worm composting. With a little investment of time and money, over the winter (in her office!) she used a large plastic bin, some soil, red wiggler worms, and spent approximately 1/2 hour a week to feed and look after her worms.

Maddy's pilot project results were excellent! In less than six months, her worms produced a natural, odor-free compost, rich in the nutrients needed for a garden.

For a detaileded "how to", there are great sites on the internet or books to read which provide the simple steps involved. This fun project is low in cost, diverts food waste and produces excellent compost!





Get bedding for your worms use leaves, straw, shredded paper, shredded cardboard, egg cartons.





Care for your worms – worms breed at two months old and like being part of the family. At least Maddy thinks so.



When ready, screen the vermiculture and voila! Your worms produce high-nutrient fertilizer!

Upcoming Changes for Waste Disposal in Nova Scotia

NEW Light Bulb Collection Program



Beginning August 1st, 2024, a Light Bulb Collection Program is coming on board. Drop off will be at the Jim Bradley Recycling Depot and Dingwall Transfer Station. Light bulbs will be banned from disposal and accepted for recycling. This includes all types of bulbs from florescent to incandescent bulbs. We will shed more light on this new recycling program in the summer issue of Victoria County News & Views.

Provincial Treated Wood Disposal Ban

As of July 5th, 2024, due to changes made to the Construction and Demolition (C&D) Regulations by the Province, treated wood (chemically treated during manufacturing to resist decay such as pressure-treated wood or creosote timber) can no longer be disposed of at C&D sites.




Expanded Electronics Recycling Program

On June 1st, 2024, the Electronics Recycling Program is expanding to include new items! Drop these off at the Jim Bradley Recycling Depot or Dingwall Transfer Station. The items listed below will be banned from disposal. Recycle—don't toss!

- Floor and Carpet Care appliances
- Garment Care appliances (steamer)
- Counter-top cooking appliances (toaster, electric kettles)
- · Devices for sealing containers or packages
- · Personal care appliances (hairdryers, electric razers)
- Scales (digital weigh scales)
- Portable air treatment appliances (humidifiers, air purifiers)
- Devices for measuring time (digital timers, clocks)

Examples of Budget Expenditures

General Government Services – council, administrative departments, election expenses, not-for-profit grants, taxation related expenses

Protective Services – RCMP contributions, Emergency Management planning, volunteer fire department funding and fire support services

Transportation Services – Victoria County Transit, municipally owned roads, sidewalks and street lights

Waste Collection & Disposal – Waste transfer stations (2), recycling depots (2), curbside pickup, sorting and disposal

2024-2025 Victoria County Tax Rates:

Residential – \$1.15 per \$100 assessment

Commercial - \$2.09 per \$100 assessment

Resource Property -\$1.15 per \$100 assessment

Taxation fiscal year is April 1, 2024 – March 31, 2025

Property taxes are due August 1, 2024

Property Tax Billing

Update your address! You are responsible for making sure that the Municipality has your correct address. Please let us know if you move so that we can update your civic address and mailing information.

Low Income Tax Exemption

You may qualify for a Low-Income Tax Exemption on your Municipal Property Taxes. If your household income is less than \$35,000/year, you may qualify for a \$300 tax credit. Application forms are available at the Municipal Building at 495 Chebucto St. in Baddeck and online at victoriacounty.ca.

Seniors Tax Rebate

Seniors living in Victoria County who receive the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) may also be eligible for the Nova Scotia property tax rebate. Community Development

Trails Development Plan—Update

- The current trails development plan has 3 phases.
 Research- Completed, Trails Development In progress, and finally, Management, Maintenance & Marketing.
- 35 kms out of a planned 73 kms of multi-use trails are currently complete or under development.
- We've successfully partnered with local trail user groups to tackle projects like the Mary Barker Trail into Ingonish, and the Big Glenn Road in Big Baddeck.
- Trailheads at Hunter's Mountain, and North River are being planned for 2024, while Trailheads at Big Baddeck, St. Ann's and Ingonish will be completed later in the timeline.



The focus for 2024/2025 will be to:

- Complete the connection through Big Baddeck. Connectors to the Gaelic College, Baddeck Inlet, and a non-motorized trail to Bald Mountain will follow in 2026/2027.
- Priorities are on safe trail surfaces, bridges and access to the trails system. Secondary focus is on the experience for trail users, access and sustainable use of destination points.
- Program funding is available for not-for-profit groups and trail users for work on the trail projects that align with Municipal Trails Development Plans.
